2021 Local Law Highlights Another busy year!

The Board of Trustees continues to update the Village Code to improve our community and better the lifestyle that

Briarcliff Manor residents enjoy. Nearly two dozen local laws were implemented, including:

- Changes to the CT Zones
- A rewrite of the local Wetlands law
- Improvements to building construction and fire protection
- Adjustments to site development approvals
- Protections for streets and sidewalks
- Implementing an abandoned building registry
- Codifying requirements for fire safety, including knox boxes
- Enhancements to the Special Permits law
- Creation of Affordable Housing Guidelines
- Modernizing regulations for solar energy collections, solar farms, battery energy storage systems
- Revamp Cabaret licenses
- Local regulations effecting legalization of marijuana
- Controlling local marijuana dispensaries and lounges

A LOOK AHEAD: WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE VILLAGE IN 2022!

The Club Field —Walking Track The Department of Public Works will be constructing a new walking track around The Club Field. This is part of the Village's plan to integrate the Village's recreation facilities with the Club's Walking Trail that provides for pedestrian access to the Lower Village area of The Club's property. This is a good opportunity for a quick workout, 4 Laps on the track are equivalent to 1 mile.



Central Business District

Take note of several exciting projects that the Village has been working on for some time now.

At the North of the Central Business District (between North State Road and Poplar) the Village has completed its first segment of its planned mobility enhancements. Please take a look at the new sidewalks, curbing, landscape and crosswalk

that was recently installed. For your nighttime visit, take note of the LED Dark Sky compliant lighting – this lamp posts elegantly light up the sidewalk and the adjoining areas without any ambient light pollution.

Future projects include the Cross Access Parking and Circulation Plan that will soon be implemented. This project will provide for circulation and parking behind several of the merchants located on the East Side of Pleasantville Road with direct connections to the Municipal Parking Lot and Pleasantville Road and a grant from Hudson River Valley Greenway was received which will be used to create the bike connector path connecting the North County Trailway and the CBD.

All of the above projects are part of the Village's overall Mobility Enhancement project that includes new sidewalks, curbing and parking throughout the Village's Central Business District and the expansion of the CBD beyond the Village's Post Office. In addition to these improvements will be new landscaping, street trees and street furniture. The Village has held numerous public workshops on this project with the latest being conducted in mid-November.

The Village is in the process of further refining the design of the project to incorporate some of the feedback residents and merchants provided on the initial plans. The next public workshop will be held in the first quarter of 2022.

Hello Briarcliff Manor Community! We are excited to be joining Neighbors (free app found in both Google Play and iPhone app store) in our efforts to connect with residents and improve the safety of our communities. Neighbors allows you, the user, to share photos, videos and information related to local crime and safety incidents so fellow residents can stay informed.

The BMPD can view what local residents have posted publicly to Neighbors and can now chime-in with relevant updates or safety alerts to help residents stay informed. You do not need a Ring device to join Neighbors. Anyone with a smartphone can download the Neighbors App in order to receive updates and have the option to post photos or videos from any device. Submissions are made anonymously and locations are hidden (general area given).

How do you teach your children to “Do the right thing”?

How do you repay a team of men and women who patrol the streets during a hurricane clearing downed trees and roping off damaged power lines? What will your kids see in you if all those people were you?

Parents encourage their children to lead challenging but balanced lives, take new courses, meet new people, work hard, help others, and enjoy life. Research shows that by just having the conversation about these choices does work. Research also shows that parents who volunteer will raise a family that does the same. Not just because role modeling works but also because parents who volunteer are likely to provide their kids with the socioeconomic resources necessary for them to volunteer too.

So, if you are a parent doing all the right things to be a positive and effective role model for your family, nice job. Keep up the great work. LAW PARK ICE RINK RETURNS FOR 9th YEAR!

The Village's "NiceRink", temporary ice skating rink, replaced the Law Park Pond as our official location for recreational ice skating during the winter of 2012-13. Although the rink took a year off during the 2020-21 winter season, we are pleased to announce it will be returning for its ninth season this year! The rink measures 104' x 56' and features 18" high plastic boards. Installation is underway on Law Park Tennis Court #4 (the asphalt court) and the rink will open as soon as natural freezing can be achieved.



As we have in past seasons, we are asking all residents wishing to utilize the rink to "buy in" and support this offering by purchasing a 2021-22 seasonal "Ice Skating Permit" for each member of their family that may want to skate this winter. Our permit system is simple and inexpensive. The seasonal permits are \$5.00 per person for Village residents; and \$10.00 per person for School District residents and Guests.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS

Overnight Winter Parking Restrictions:
Starting December 1, and through March 31, the annual overnight parking ban is in effect. The ban prohibits parking from 2:00 AM to 6:00 AM on any Village street, road or Municipal Parking lot with the exception of the Scarborough Train Station Parking Lot. Overnight parking at VBM's Railroad Station lot is prohibited from 3:00 AM to 6:00 AM. Violators will be fined.

Tax Payment: The second installment of Village property taxes are due on or before Monday, January 3, 2022. Village Hall will be open until 4:30pm to accept payments in person. A clear and legible postmarked date of January 3, 2022 is acceptable for payments that are mailed to Village Hall. Payments can also be made online without penalty until 11:59pm or dropped in the drop box in front of Village Hall on January 3rd.
