NORTH STATE ROAD EMERGENCY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

The severe storm surge and runoff from Hurricane Irene collapsed a section of North State Road between Pleasantville Road and Route 9A. The road surface was severely undermined and was barricaded off while engineers planned for a major construction project.

The Project went out for bid and NYSDOT awarded the bid to lowest responsible bidder. The \$900K project is fully funded by Federal and State funds and the NYSDOT is the lead agency in this project. Daytime and nighttime construction was done to accelerate the project's completion.

The Village took several steps to alleviate some resident and merchant concerns and met regularly with the NYSDOT and the Contractor (Morano Brothers) to discuss the overall project, goals and timetables together with the village's demand to segment the specific construction work.

- Electric traffic sign boards were set alerting people to the closure of North State Road; and a detour plan was instituted for the duration of the project.
- Vital village sewer utilities were relocated during construction and water service to the Briarcliff Commons was re-routed largely behind the business district.
- The pedestrian walkway was temporarily relocated to Pleasantville Road: to run between Route 9A and the east-side of Birrittella's.

The box-culverts were redesigned to be inserted in-between the subterranean old bridge stone walls and atop the existing stream bed: causing a time-delay. Additional delays were caused by heavy rains but the 15 box culverts were delivered on December 9th and a crane was assembled on site to position the culverts into place in rapid succession. Nevertheless, we have targeted the restoration of at least 1 lane (and perhaps 2 lanes) of North State east-west traffic towards the end of this week.

The timetable was fully dependent on the weather and construction needs and conditions. The heavy rains have caused additional efforts to divert the volume of water around the construction site. Separately, landscaping, the replacement and widening of the sidewalks and expanded street lighting on the south side of North State Road will be undertaken **after** the New Year in order to expedite the **road re-opening now**.

Once again, thank you for consideration and understanding in this matter.

DOG LICENSING

HOW DO I LICENSE MY DOG?

Apply by mail or in person using the application available on the Village website www.briarcliffmanor.org or at Village Hall.

In addition to the application the owner will need:

- if the dog is spayed or neutered - a certificate from a licensed veterinarian or an affidavit from the owner showing that the dog has been spayed or neutered, unless this proof is already on file with the clerk;
- ALL dogs three months or older must have proof of a **rabies vaccination** signed by a licensed veterinarian or a certificate stating why the life of the dog would be endangered by the vaccine; and
- a check payable to the Village of Briarcliff Manor for the appropriate license fee.

WHAT DOGS SHOULD BE LICENSED?

Pursuant to Article 7 of New York State Agriculture and Markets Law:

Every dog, regardless of age, owned or harbored in the Village for longer than 30 days must be licensed . The following are the **only license exemptions**:

- if the dog is under four months of age and not running-at-large (off the owner's premises)
- if a non-resident brings a dog into the Village for less than 30 days and the dog is licensed according to the resident state's licensing laws.

PROPERTY TAX REMINDER

Village Real Property Tax Bills for 2011 were mailed at the end of May 2011. The Second Installment is due by January 3, 2012. Penalties accrue on unpaid taxes each month that they remain unpaid. SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW WHEN HIRING AN ELECTRICIAN, PLUMBER OR HOME IMPROVEMENT CONTRACTOR

Westchester County law requires all home improvement contractors, plumbers and electricians to have a county license. The law was enacted to prevent homeowners from being taken advantage of by fly-by-night companies. It also protects legitimate contractors, who are licensed and insured and have worked successfully in the county for years.

Visit **www.consumer.westchestergov.com** for a full list of licensed Home Improvement contractors or visit **<https://wro.westchesterclerk.com>** to search our database of licensed plumbers and electricians to learn if the person you are about to hire has a current license and to check the expiration dates of their insurance policies.

The following tips are offered for hiring home improvement contractors, plumbers or electricians:

- Avoid contractors who show up at your doorstep unannounced or contact you through telemarketing.
- Avoid contractors who demand payment in cash or want more than one-third of the total payment before work has begun.
- Get at least three estimates, especially if the job is big. In assessing the estimates, do not always go with the low bidder. A higher price may be worth it if the contractor is the most experienced, will use better materials, will do a better job, and keep to a timeline.
- Be wary of an extremely low bid. It may be an indication that the contractor is overeager for your business, made a mistake in preparing the bid or is not including all the work quoted by the other bidders.
- Ask each contractor for references, and call the references to see if they were satisfied with the work. Also, see for yourself by visiting the homes where the contractor has done work.
- Get It in Writing: Once you've decided on a contractor, plumber or electrician, insist on a written contract that sets forth all important details of the job. Do NOT agree to an oral contract. The written agreement should include what is expected should be drawn up before work begins to ensure you will get the work done within a reasonable time and at a reasonable cost.
- Lastly, upon completion of any work and before final payments are made to any contractor, please contact the Building Department to insure that all required "close-out" paperwork is in order.

CARBON MONOXIDE SAFETY TIPS

As we close up our homes for winter and turn on our heating systems, the potential of CO poisoning increases. CO or Carbon Monoxide is an odorless, tasteless and colorless gas created by any carbon based fuel source. To protect your family please do the following:

1. If you do not have a CO Detector, get one and replace any units over 5 years old
2. Make sure the battery is fresh
3. If your CO alarm activates, call 911 and move your children and pets outside the home. Do not stop to open windows or try and find out where the problem is. The fire department is trained to investigate CO calls and has the necessary equipment to evaluate the cause.

SMOKE ALARMS

Few of us realize how easily — and how quickly — fire can harm our loved ones. Fortunately, there is a simple, affordable way to help prevent this from happening: the smoke alarm.

Buy smoke alarms – and cut your family’s risk in half. Experts report that consumers may cut their risk of dying in a home fire in half simply by having a smoke alarm installed. Smoke alarms are available at nearly all hardware, department and discount stores, often for under \$20. So don’t delay – get out there and buy one. The peace of mind you’ll have from knowing that your family is safe and secure is worth the investment.

Look for the UL Mark : The UL Mark tells you that a representative sample of the smoke alarm has been evaluated by UL scientists and engineers to nationally recognized safety requirements.

Don’t just buy one! There’s safety in numbers: Install at least one smoke alarm on each floor of the house or residence and outside all sleeping areas. Some fire safety advocates recommend installing smoke alarms inside each sleeping area if sleeping with the door closed.

Keep your alarms working properly: Test and maintain your smoke alarms at least once a month, or follow the manufacturer’s instructions. Smoke alarms most often fail because of missing, dead or disconnected batteries. Replace batteries at least once a year. Testing is generally as simple as pushing a button and listening to hear the beep.

RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS

BRUSH: Branches must be less than 6" in diameter and cut to 5' or less in length and TIED. Small loose brush must be placed in paper bags for curbside pickup on Recycle Wednesday.

CELL PHONES: contain a number of dangerous toxic materials that should be kept out of the waste stream. Westchester County passed a cell phone recycling law making it illegal to throw the phones in the garbage. Cell phones may be recycled in a Collection Box located at the Department of Public Works.

COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS (CFL)

Fluorescent lighting contains mercury, so it should not be disposed of with household trash. CFL's are accepted at Household Recycling Days and also at Home Depot.

CO-MINGLE RECYCLING: Containers (glass, metal and plastic) can be co-mingled in one bin. Place material in an open container for pickup (maximum size - 32 gallons). Blue 14 or 22 gallon recycling containers are available for purchase at DPW for \$12.

GLASS: Recyclable Clear or colored glass that did contain food or beverage. Please rinse out all containers and **DO NOT INCLUDE CAPS OR LIDS. Not Recyclable:** Broken glass, china, crystal, glassware, pottery, ceramics, pyrex, light bulbs, fluorescent light bulbs, broken glass mirror, glass containing lead, such as auto and window glass, pesticide/herbicide containers, or any non-food or non beverage containers.

METAL: Recyclable – Food cans, beverage cans, aerosol cans, metal lids/caps aluminum pie tins, trays and foil wrap. All metals should be clean and free of food. No need to remove labels. **Not Recyclable:** Oil and paint cans, metal clothing hangers, and containers labeled toxic or corrosive.

NEWSPAPER, GREY CARDBOARD & OTHER PAPER: Recyclable – All newspaper, including glossy inserts, junk mail, envelopes, office waste paper, magazines, phone books, stapled and glued catalogs, paper with crayon, brown paper bags and grey cardboard such as cereal/tissue boxes, toilet & paper towels rolls and flattened corrugated cardboard boxes. Material should be tied, placed in blue bin/cardboard or brown paper bags. **Not Recyclable:** Books, wrapping paper, painted paper and carbon paper and plastic grocery bags.

OIL, ANTI-FREEZE & BATTERIES: Recyclable – Used motor oil and anti-freeze – MAY BE DROPPED OFF AT DPW GARAGE **Not Recyclable:** Cooking oil. Most small batteries, such as flashlight can be disposed with your regular household garbage.

PLASTIC: Numbers 1-7 Please rinse out all containers and **DO NOT INCLUDE CAPS OR LIDS. Not Recyclable:** Plastic bags, polystyrene products, such as foam cups, plates & packing material, plastic utensils, clear plastic wraps and bags, food wrappers, plastic flower pots, toys, or hazardous containers, such as motor oil containers or pesticide containers. Westchester County accepts plastic bags for recycling at Household Recycling Days. In addition, many stores have established an in-store Plastic Bag Collection and Recycling Program, placing receptacles near or at the entrance to the store.

BULK METAL MUST BE SCHEDULED FOR PICKUP ON RECYCLE WEDNESDAY

(i.e. *E-Waste items, grills, lawn mowers, metal fencing, pipes, small TV's etc.). Some items may require a fee/permit (Refrigerator, Freezer, Dehumidifier, A/C, Washer, Dryer, Treadmill, Large TV's, etc.)

***E-WASTE:** computer monitors, TVs, VCRs, computer towers & accessories, printers, faxes, phones, small appliances, i.e. toasters, blenders, radios, stereos, speakers, lamps.

\$30 PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

FREON FILLED APPLIANCES: Air conditioners, Freezers, Refrigerators, and Dehumidifiers

BULK METALS: Large Appliances, (*Washer, Dryer, Stove, Hot Water Heater, etc.*) Grills, Metal Furniture, Metal Doors, File Cabinets, Lawn Equipment/Mowers and Large quantities of Aluminum Siding, Metal Pipes, Sheet Metal, Wire Fencing, etc.
