DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

Unwanted telemarketing calls are both irritating and intrusive. In 2000, New York enacted the "Do Not Call" law that allows consumers to place their telephone numbers on a central registry to reduce the number of unsolicited telemarketing calls they receive.

However, telemarketers licensed in other states continue to harass New Yorkers, subject only to a negligible fine. To make sure all telemarketers are held to the same standard, legislation was recently enacted that requires telemarketers doing business in New York to register with the Department of State, which will have the authority to ban companies that violate state telemarketing laws.

BLUE STAR MEMORIAL BY-WAY MARKER DEDICATION

The Briarcliff Manor Garden Club with the Village's help, placed a By-Way Marker at the Pocket Park on Pleasantville Road on July 31, 2012. The By-Way Marker honors those that have dedicated their lives for our safety and freedom during this time of war and unrest in the world. The project was named for the Blue Star in the service flag which hung in the window of homes and business' to honor servicemen and women. A Blue Star Banner hung in the window of a home meant that family had someone in service. The flag made its appearance during WW II and appeared once again during the Persian Gulf War. The tradition is being brought forth once again by placing the Blue Star on a By-Way Marker, permitted in parks, historical sites and other civic locations. Those closest to us are Ardsley and White Plains. The Village of Briarcliff Manor is now part of this living memorial. The Blue Star By-Way Marker will reach from state to state across the country. This is truly a fitting tribute to those who have served or are serving their country. There will be a dedication ceremony at the Pocket Park on Community Day, September 8th at 11AM.
