VACANT HOUSE CHECKS

Vacant house checks – if you will be away during the holiday season please be aware that the Police Dept can do individual checks on your home. Please call the main number to register.

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

Now that the snow season is upon us please be reminded that residents have to clear their sidewalks of all snow & ice within 24 hours of a snowfall. Also remember to remove the snow from the roof of your automobiles prior to driving as this causes a hazardous condition to vehicles behind you, and is now a NY State law.

ALARM PERMITS

If you are a new resident please remember all home alarm systems must be registered in the Village of Briarcliff. If you acquired an existing alarm in your home it must be re-registered in your name. Alarm Permits are renewed annually and will be sent out in January. Please contact the office at 941-4800 for additional information.

DOG LICENSING

HOW DO I LICENSE MY DOG?

Apply by mail or in person using the application available on the Village website www.briarcliffmanor.org or at Village Hall.

In addition to the application the owner will need:

- if the dog is spayed or neutered - a certificate from a licensed veterinarian or an affidavit from the owner showing that the dog has been spayed or neutered, unless this proof is already on file with the clerk;
- ALL dogs three months or older must have proof of a **rabies vaccination** signed by a licensed veterinarian or a certificate stating why the life of the dog would be endangered by the vaccine; and
- a check payable to the Village of Briarcliff Manor for the appropriate license fee.

WHAT DOGS SHOULD BE LICENSED?

Pursuant to Article 7 of New York State Agriculture and Markets Law:

Every dog, regardless of age, owned or harbored in the Village for longer than 30 days must be licensed . The following are the **only license exemptions**:

- if the dog is under four months of age and not running-at-large (off the owner's premises)
- if a non-resident brings a dog into the Village for less than 30 days and the dog is licensed according to the resident state's licensing laws.

OVERNIGHT PARKING REMINDER

December 1st through March 31st overnight parking is prohibited from 2a.m.– 6a.m. on any Village street, road or Municipal Parking lot with the exception of the Scarborough Train Station Parking Lot where overnight parking is prohibited from 3a.m.—6a.m.

PROPERTY TAX REMINDER

Village Real Property Tax Bills for 2012 were mailed at the end of May 2012. The Second Installment is due by December 31, 2012. Penalties accrue on unpaid taxes each month that they remain unpaid. A penalty of 5% will be applied on all unpaid balances as of January 1, 2013. Additional penalties will accrue each month the taxes remained unpaid.

NEW ICE SKATING RINK!

The Village is pleased to announce that a new temporary ice skating rink is being installed on Tennis Court #2 in Law Park, effectively replacing the Law Park Pond as our official location for recreational ice skating for our residents. The new rink will measure 100' x 52' and will open for use as soon as natural freezing can be achieved. Locating the rink system inside Law Court #2 comes with the benefits of convenient parking in the spaces by Atria and being able to offer night skating utilizing the court's lighting system. We anticipate scheduling hours for open skating, designating specific time slots for "pond hockey" play, and even offering the opportunity for residents to rent the rink for private skating parties if they wish. Further details regarding the operation of the new skating area will be available soon and we hope you share our enthusiasm for this new recreational amenity!

RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS

BRUSH: Branches must be less than 6" in diameter and cut to 5' or less in length and TIED. Small loose brush must be placed in paper bags for curbside pickup on Recycle Wednesday.

CELL PHONES: contain a number of dangerous toxic materials that should be kept out of the waste stream. Westchester County passed a cell phone recycling law making it illegal to throw the phones in the garbage. Cell phones may be recycled in a Collection Box located at the Department of Public Works.

COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS (CFL)

Fluorescent lighting contains mercury, so it should not be disposed of with household trash. CFL's are accepted at Household Recycling Days and also at Home Depot.

CO-MINGLE RECYCLING: Containers (glass, metal and plastic) can be co-mingled in one bin. Place material in an open container for pickup (maximum size - 32 gallons). Blue 14 or 22 gallon recycling containers are available for purchase at DPW for \$12.

GLASS: Recyclable Clear or colored glass that did contain food or beverage. Please rinse out all containers. **Not Recyclable:** Broken glass, china, crystal, glassware, pottery, ceramics, pyrex, light bulbs, fluorescent light bulbs, broken glass mirror, glass containing lead, such as auto and window glass, pesticide/herbicide containers, or any non-food or non beverage containers.

METAL: Recyclable – Food cans, beverage cans, aerosol cans, metal lids/caps aluminum pie tins, trays and foil wrap. All metals should be clean and free of food. No need to remove labels. **Not Recyclable:** Oil and paint cans, metal clothing hangers, and containers labeled toxic or corrosive.

NEWSPAPER, GREY CARDBOARD & OTHER PAPER: Recyclable – All newspaper, including glossy inserts, junk mail, envelopes, office waste paper, magazines, phone books, stapled and glued catalogs, paper with crayon, brown paper bags and grey cardboard such as cereal/tissue boxes, toilet & paper towels rolls and flattened corrugated cardboard boxes. Material should be tied, placed in blue bin/cardboard or brown paper bags. **Not Recyclable:** Books, wrapping paper, painted paper and carbon paper and plastic grocery bags.

OIL, ANTI-FREEZE & BATTERIES: Recyclable – Used motor oil and anti-freeze – MAY BE DROPPED OFF AT DPW GARAGE **Not Recyclable:** Cooking oil. Most small batteries, such as flashlight can be disposed with your regular household garbage.

PLASTIC: Numbers 1-7 Please rinse out all containers and DO NOT INCLUDE CAPS OR LIDS. **Not Recyclable:** Plastic bags, polystyrene products, such as foam cups, plates & packing material, plastic utensils, clear plastic wraps and bags, food wrappers, plastic flower pots, toys, or hazardous containers, such as motor oil containers or pesticide containers. Westchester County accepts plastic bags for recycling at Household Recycling Days. In addition, many stores have established an in-store Plastic Bag Collection and Recycling Program, placing receptacles near or at the entrance to the store.

BULK METAL MUST BE SCHEDULED FOR PICKUP ON RECYCLE WEDNESDAY

(i.e. *E-Waste items, grills, lawn mowers, metal fencing, pipes, small TV's etc.). Some items may require a fee/permit (Refrigerator, Freezer, Dehumidifier, A/C, Washer, Dryer, Treadmill, Large TV's, etc.)

***E-WASTE:** computer monitors, TVs, VCRs, computer towers & accessories, printers, faxes, phones, small appliances, i.e. toasters, blenders, radios, stereos, speakers, lamps.

\$30 PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

FREON FILLED APPLIANCES: Air conditioners, Freezers, Refrigerators, and Dehumidifiers

BULK METALS: Large Appliances, (*Washer, Dryer, Stove, Hot Water Heater, etc.*) Grills, Metal Furniture, Metal Doors, File Cabinets, Lawn Equipment/Mowers and Large quantities of Aluminum Siding, Metal Pipes, Sheet Metal, Wire Fencing, etc.

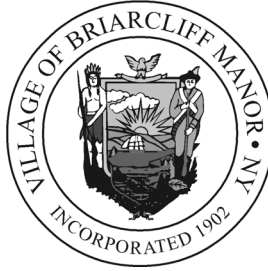
