Happy New Year ... I have to tell you that we are really looking forward to 2019. The Mayor and Board of Trustees join me in wishing all of our residents good health with our best wishes for a happy and prosperous New Year. Numerous strategic projects and a series of Nor'easters proved daunting this past year. Some of these projects had to be carried over to Spring 2019 due to NYSDEC regulations ... like the Pocantico River Bridge replacement. Others like our "Safe Routes to Schools" have been completed. Expect more projects afoot as we tackle other needs such as the important dredging of Law Park Pond.

As a result of citizen led studies of our "B-Zone" properties (those properties primarily 3 shuttered former corporate offices) significant, repurposed interest in these properties has arisen. Primary interest is focused on new housing for a defined target residential market. The M/BOT has established an expanded process enabling our residents to see, hear and participate as potential future project uses are proposed.

Technology and communications are center stage. We initiated a top to bottom review and update of our website to make information more friendly, accessible and available for everyone. We expect that you will be seeing results of our efforts within weeks. Let us know what you think should be added, refined ... and maybe deleted from our current website. PROPERTY TAX REMINDER

Village Real Property Tax Bills for 2018 were mailed at the end of May 2018. The Second Installment is due by December 31, 2018. Penalties accrue on unpaid taxes each month that they remain unpaid. A penalty of 5% will be applied on all unpaid balances as of January 1, 2019. Additional penalties will accrue each month the taxes remained unpaid. The payment coupon for the Second Installment is attached to the bills that were mailed in May – **no additional bills will be mailed. Online credit card or e-check payments are accepted.**

RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS

ORGANIC WASTE

BAGGED LEAVES & GRASS CLIPPINGS: Bagged leaves are picked up at curbside.

BULK LEAVES: Bulk leaf pick up at the curbside (including bagged leaves) must be placed within the Village's Right Of Way (usually the first 10 feet from the road edge): not in the road. We cover the Village in a series of several laps, each taking between two to three weeks to complete. We do not respond to scheduling requests: and continue pick up until complete. Do not mix sticks or brush with leaves. Once the final lap is complete, bulk leaf pick up kicks into the schedule for bagged leaves, above. You can also drop off leaves at DPW or provide a note for your landscaper to drop them off on your behalf.

BRUSH: Branches must be less than 6" in diameter and cut to 5' or less in length and TIED in manageable bundles. Small loose brush must be placed in paper bags for curbside pick up on Recycle Wednesday.

LOGS: Logs and brush in excess of 6" diameter and longer than 5' **will not** be picked up. You will have to make other arrangements for disposal.

CHRISTMAS TREES: Christmas trees are picked up at the curbside on your Recycle Wednesday.

NOTE: All organic waste material meeting the above criteria can be dropped off by you or your landscaper (with a note from you) at the DPW yard at 10 Buckhout Road, all year, Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Residents and landscapers must sign in at the DPW office.

RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS CONTINUED

COMINGLE MATERIALS (CANS, BOTTLES, PLASTIC CONTAINERS): Will be picked up on your Recycle Wednesday. Comingle material must be placed curbside in a container no larger than 32 gallons and without wheels.

ACCEPTED

Metal food/beverage cans
Aluminum foil & trays
Aerosol cans
Waxed cartons, milk, juice & soup etc.
Plastics coded 1 through 7 food/household
Glass food/beverage containers

NOT ACCEPTED

Paint cans, chemical containers, metal coat hangers
Plastic bags (take to a local grocery store)
Styrofoam, plastic toys, window glass and kitchenware

PAPER AND CARDBOARD MATERIALS: Will be picked up on your Recycle Wednesday. Paper must be placed curbside and in a container (No larger than 14 gallons), or in a small cardboard box, paper bags or in small tied bundles.

ACCEPTED

Newspaper & magazines
Envelopes & junk mail
Cereal, tissue & pizza boxes
Cardboard boxes (Flattened)

NOT ACCEPTED

Hard cover and paperback books
Milk cartons (considered comingle)
Wrapping paper

PAINT: Paint in cans must be hardened prior to disposal. Open cans and harden paint by one of these methods: kitty litter, speedy dry absorbent or waste paint hardener. Please leave lids off and dispose of dried cans in a garbage bag placed at the curb on your garbage pick-up day.

METAL/ELECTRONIC E-WASTE: Metal and e-waste will be picked up **Only by**

Appointment on your Recycle Wednesday. Bulk metal or large e-waste items require a \$40.00 fee for pick up. The fee will be waived if items are transported to the D.P.W. for disposal by the resident.

HOUSEHOLD MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY (H-MRF)

The H-MRF accepts household hazardous waste and many recyclable items from residents on a year-round, appointment-only basis. The facility is located on the Grassland's Campus, 15 Woods Road, Valhalla, NY. Open Tuesday, Thursday & Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. For further information and to set up an appointment, please call (914) 813-5425 or visit <http://environment.westchestergov.com> Fluorescent/CFL bulbs, Automotive Fluids (Antifreeze, brake fluid, etc. but NO motor oil), Chemicals, Stains, Fire Extinguishers all can be taken to H-MRF.

Motor Oil: Take to a service station (Free up to 5 gallons per person).

Vehicle Batteries: Take to retailer who sells them (Free up to 2 vehicle batteries per person).

Tires: Take to retailer who sells them or H-MRF up to 4 allowed.

Propane tanks: Take to retailer who sells them or H-MRF.
